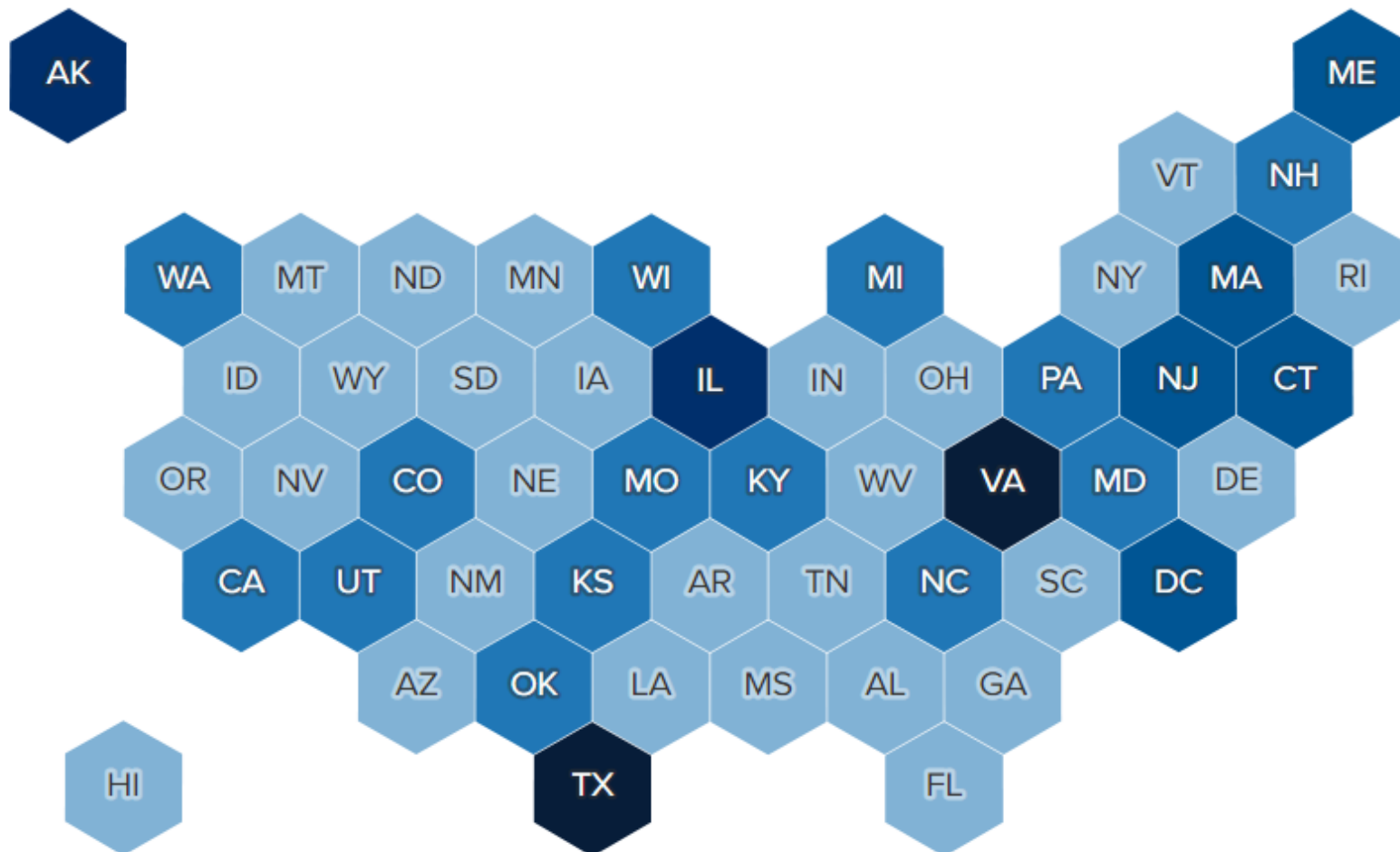
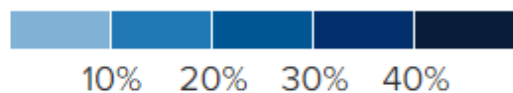

- **\$723 million** for the Indian Housing Block Grant (IHBG) Program
- **\$85 million** for Fair Housing Programs
- **\$1.9 billion** for the HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program.
